



The program review team met April 11, 2007 to discuss information collected and presented in the Program Review Outline.

II. Analysis of Results:

A. Strengths

- Program purpose is accurate and up to date
- Program is accredited by the National Accrediting Agency of Clinical Laboratory Sciences until February 2009
- 100% pass rate for students who have taken the National Registry exam
- Advisory Committee is supportive of the program
- Survey results show that current students and graduates are pleased with the program

B. Weaknesses

- Phlebotomists are seen as entry level employees

C. Opportunities/Threats

- Student enrollment is limited by the number of clinical sites we have
- More students could take the National Registry Exam if funds were available to help offset the cost
- Employers require students to be able to use computers

III. Committee Recommendations

Continue program with following recommendations:

- Administer Advisory Committee survey at the annual meeting for better response

- Instructor is commended for running a professional program and for the 100% pass rate of students taking the National Registry Exam
- Apply for a Foundation mini grant requesting funds to supplement the cost for students who wish to take the National Registry Exam
- Explore the possibility of offering CIS 111 as part of the curriculum because of industry standards
- Consider a pinning ceremony for completers
- Continue program and review in five years
